GDPR Statement

This Privacy Policy explains what information is collected about you, how it is used, and the steps taken to ensure that it is kept secure.

The information we collect and its sources

We will obtain details including:

Contact details, date of birth and medical information of those registering as members of the club and their parents/guardians.

Other information that is relevant such as photo ID, clothing size for purchases of kit or other clothing items, allergy information, treatment or care that may need to be given to help you or others who attend matches or other events. Details of the support information needed will be shown on the relevant document.

Gender / disability / ethnicity information to enable us to ensure we meet our social inclusion and anti-discrimination responsibilities.

Where we obtain information

In most cases we will obtain information directly from you or the device you use to communicate with us. The information will be obtained through Registration documents, telephone conversations, emails and written and verbal communications.

How we will use your information

All personal information that we obtain about you and/or any other person whose details you provide will be recorded, used, and protected by us in accordance with current GDPR legislation. We will primarily use the personal information for:

Administration. For registration and general administration

Communication. To communicate with you

Safety. To ensure a safe environment for the enjoyment of football matches, events and activities

Records. For record keeping purposes

Consent and lawful processing of personal data

The legal basis for the collection and processing of your personal data is:

For administration

For dealing with medical needs: that you have given your explicit consent or, in serious cases that it is in your vital interests to help you

For equality and inclusion: that you have given your explicit consent by answering the question

In all other cases: that it is necessary for our legitimate interests which are to encourage participation in football and this does not prejudice or harm your rights and freedoms

Disclosing your personal information

We will only share relevant personal information where we believe this is appropriate. i.e. with other club officials, opposing team managers, the league, The Fa / County FA etc.

Storing your personal information

All digital information will be stored either:

in password protected files, on password protected computers with current antivirus software installed or

on a password protected removable drive stored in a secure location

Any hardcopy information will be stored in a secure location

Disposing of your personal information

In accordance with current legislation, once a member has left the club any information held will be destroyed within 1 year.
